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## Sights



**A City Hall and Perlach Tower:** City Hall, built by Elias Holl from 1616 to 1620 and the city's landmark, is said to be the most significant secular Renaissance building north of the Alps. The restored Golden Hall is famous for its grand portals, coffered ceiling and mural paintings. Open daily 10 a.m.-6 p.m. except during private events. The Perlach Tower next to City Hall offers a spectacular panoramic view of Augsburg (Easter to end of October and on Advent weekends).

**B C D Magnificent fountains:** Splendid fountain monuments with precious bronze sculptures originated around 1600 on Maximilianstrasse, also known as "the imperial mile." Augustus **B**, Mercury **C** and Hercules **D** fountains.

**E Cathedral:** The Romanesque and Gothic St. Mary's Cathedral intrigues visitors with impressive frescos, a Romanesque crypt, the oldest glass painting cycle in the world as well as four panel paintings by Hans Holbein the Elder, and Roman walls on the cathedral square.

**F Diocesan Museum:** The museum next to the cathedral exhibits a vast number of art treasures including the 11th century bronze doors of the Augsburg cathedral and the worldwide unique funeral artifacts of Emperor Charles V.



**G Mozart House:** The birthplace of Leopold Mozart, father of Wolfgang Amadé Mozart, is a bourgeois house which dates from the 16th and 17th centuries. Today it is a memorial to the Mozarts displaying fascinating exhibits (documents about the Mozarts in Augsburg, also Leopold and Wolfgang Amadé, and a fortepiano from Stein).

**H St. Anna church:** St. Anna is a former Carmelite monastery and a Protestant church since 1525 with a newly designed museum "Lutherstiege." The tomb chapel of the Fugger family is the first German construction of the Renaissance. Valuable paintings by Lucas Cranach the Elder and the goldsmith's chapel with 14th century frescos can be viewed. Augsburg's city market with its huge selection, including regional goods, is right next door.

**I Fugger and Welser Museum:** This new museum opened in the extensively renovated Renaissance "Wiesel house." Here, the influence of Augsburg patrician families of the early 16th century in European and worldwide economic events can be vividly experienced with a new form of storytelling in interactive sections.

**J Maximilian Museum:** Bourgeois house, built in 1546. Painting of the facade was reconstructed according to old patterns. The museum presents interesting evidence of town history and a large exhibition of goldsmiths' work and silver-work of famous Augsburg masters. Roofed inner courtyard with café.

**K Synagogue:** Domed structure built by Heinrich Lömpel and Fritz Landauer from 1914 to 1917 with Jugendstil furnishing. Also home to the Museum of Jewish Culture.

**L Fugger Palace:** Residency and trading house of Jakob Fugger, built from 1512 to 1515 with charming inner courtyards (Damenhof) built in the architectural style of the Italian Renaissance. Access: Maximilianstrasse 36.

**M Badstuben:** The Badstuben in the Fugger palace are a highlight of the High Renaissance. By order of Hans Fugger, the two rooms were designed between 1568 and 1573 primarily by Italian artists. Portrayals of mythological creatures, personified seasons and signs of the zodiac decorate the walls in the tradition of ancient Roman art. Access: Maximilianstr. 36 or Zeugplatz 7

**N Schaezler Palace:** City residence of banker Liebert von Liebenhofen with a richly furnished rococo banqueting hall (1765-1770), today Germany's most significant baroque gallery. Access to State Gallery of Bavaria with paintings by past masters such as Dürer, Holbein the Elder and Cranach the Elder.



**O St. Ulrich's churches:** Catholic St. Ulrich's church: a richly furnished late Gothic basilica built in the architectural styles of Renaissance and baroque. Includes the tombs of diocesan saints Afra, Ulrich and Simpert. The Protestant St. Ulrich's church impresses with its stucco ceiling displaying ornamental art from the Régence.

**P Augsburg puppet museum "die Kiste":** The museum of the Augsburg Puppet Theater is found one floor above the theater in the Heilig-Geist-Spital, a former hospital now preserved as a historical monument. The museum includes well-loved marionettes and documentation of the theater's history.

**Q Roman Museum:** Double-span hall church of former St. Magdalene monastery featuring a multitude of prehistory exhibits and interesting finds from the Roman era. (Temporarily closed)

**R Fuggerei:** Founded in 1521 by Jakob Fugger for impoverished (Catholic) citizens of Augsburg. The world's oldest social housing settlement, it encompasses 67 houses with 140 apartments. Annual rent today, excluding service charges, is 88 cents. With Fuggerei museum, museum in WWII bunker and display apartment.



**S Brecht house:** Birthplace of Bert Brecht, born in 1898. Typical craftsman's house located on a channel of the Lech river. Today it houses the Bert Brecht memorial.

**T Walter Art Museum in the "Glass Palace":** The "Glass Palace," an industrial monument made of iron, concrete and glass, today accommodates the Walter Art Museum with more than 600 exhibits of modern art. Further exhibits can be found from the H2 Center for Contemporary Arts and the State Gallery of Modern Art.

**U Augsburg Textile and Industry Museum (tim):** In one of Bavaria's first factories, "tim" uses machines, samples and a "catwalk of fashion history" to document the once European-wide significance of the industrial city of Augsburg. One hundred years ago approximately 30,000 people worked in the spinning mills, weaving mills and dye works of this "German Manchester."

## Fugger Tour

The tour "Following the footsteps of the Fuggers" leads to 15 information boards commemorating the great Swabian family. These signs are located at various stations throughout the historical city center, and the tour can be taken completely or in part on foot. It leads to places of interest such as the Fuggerei and the Fugger chapel in St. Anna, the Fugger monument and the Fugger houses, the cathedral, the Ulrich basilica and the City Hall. The information boards are in German, English and Italian and each sign refers to the next point of interest. A "mobile audio guide" is offered for each station.

The signposting is a co-operation of the city of Augsburg, Regio Augsburg Tourismus GmbH and the Fürstlich und Gräfllich Fuggersche Stiftungen.
